## **Traveling Again - Are You Ready?**

Whether for business or pleasure, things are opening up for more travel. Are you secured and ready? Let's check!

- Do you have passwords or passcodes on all your devices?
   Check! (If not, anyone has access to your devices and all information they can access.)
- Are your devices all backed up?
   Check! (If lost or stolen, you will still have the data you started with.)
- Is Bluetooth turned off until you need it? Check! ✓ (Leaving it "on" auto-connects you to wireless and Bluetooth networks near you.)
- Is your 'Find My Phone' feature activated? Check! ✓ (You're out and about and distracted, need we say more?)
- Do you limit what you do on public WiFi? Check! (Never access banking sites or your email - they contain sensitive information that can be exposed.)
- Have you set up a VPN or personal/ mobile hotspot? Check! (If you will be using public WiFi, you should set this up.)
- Do you have a screen protector on all devices? Check! (Don't get caught with no working phone, tablet, or camera if the screen gets badly cracked.



## Other things to consider:

- Whether you're pool-side, oceanside, or around any body of water, a waterproof cellphone pouch is a good idea. If it floats, even better!
- Only take what you will need.
  You're supposed to be vacating
  your normal life, not taking it with
  you. Leave those extra credit
  cards and unnecessary electronics
  safe and secure at home, where
  you won't need to worry about
  losing them and the information
  they contain.
